Joint Statement Regarding a Possible Cash Offer for HEIT by Foresight

On 17 March 2025, the board of directors of HEIT and Foresight Group LLP, on behalf of one or more funds managed by Foresight Group LLP and its affiliates ("Foresight"), announced that they have reached agreement on the financial terms of a potential acquisition of the entire share capital of HEIT by Foresight under which HEIT shareholders would be entitled to receive 84.0 pence per share (the "Possible Cash Offer").

In accordance with Rule 2.11 of the City Code on Takeovers and Mergers (the "**Code**"), please accept this email as notification that a copy of the announcement in relation to the Possible Cash Offer released to the Regulatory Information Service of the London Stock Exchange on 17 March 2025 (the "**Announcement**") is available on the Company's website at <u>www.heitp.co.uk/investors/possible-offer</u>, so that it is readily available to you. This email is not to be taken as a summary of the information in the Announcement and should not be regarded as a substitute for reading the Announcement in full.

Although the Announcement has put the Company into what is known as an "offer period" under, and for the purposes of, the Code, there can be no certainty that Foresight will ultimately make an offer for the Company. Further announcements will be made as and when appropriate.

to below). If a 1% disclosure requirement is triggered, then under Rule 8 you must disclose the interest you hold in all relevant securities.

A Dealing Disclosure must contain details of the dealing concerned and of the person's interests and short positions in, and rights to subscribe for, any relevant securities of each of (i) the offeree company and (ii) any securities exchange offeror(s), save to the extent that these details have previously been disclosed under Rule 8. A Dealing Disclosure by a person to whom Rule 8.3(b) applies must be made by no later than 3.30 p.m. (London time) on the business day following the date of the relevant dealing.

If two or more persons act together pursuant to an agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal, to acquire or control an interest in relevant securities of an offeree company or a securities exchange offeror, they will be deemed to be a single person for the purpose of Rule 8.3.



Opening Position Disclosures must also be made by the offeree company and by any offeror and Dealing Disclosures must also be made by the offeree company, by any offeror and by any persons acting in concert with any of them (see Rules 8.1, 8.2 and 8.4).
